
The Months of the Year



The first month of the year is *Nissan* – the month in which we left Egypt and became a free people.


Sometimes, we call *Tishrei* the first month of the year, because it begins with *Rosh Hashanah* (Head of the Year).



The Shalosh Regalim

When the *Bet Hamikdash* stood in Jerusalem, Jews would come from all over Israel to visit it. They came in particular on three festivals - *Pesach*, *Shavuot* and *Succot*. Because most people travelled on foot – these are known as the שֵׁלוֹשׁ רְגָלִים (3 Foot Festivals).


Many Jews at that time were farmers and they would bring their first fruits to the *Bet Hamikdash* as a gift to God.





17th Tammuz & 9th Av

2000 years ago the Romans destroyed the second *Bet Hamikdash*.



17th of Tammuz:

The Romans broke though the city wall of Jerusalem.



9th of Av:

The Romans burnt the *Bet Hamikdash* to the ground.


The 'three weeks'

The three weeks is the saddest time of the year for us – so we don't hold a *simchah* and we don't cut our hair during this time.

According to tradition, the 9th of *Av* is also the day on which the first *Bet Hamikdash*, built by King Solomon, was destroyed.




Jewish history can be divided approximately into four periods:



The Tanach is made up of 24 books




Torah tells the story of the Jewish people up to the point when they went into the land of Israel.

Nach (Nevi'im and Ketuvim) is the story and writings of the Jewish people living in the land of Israel.




Tanach Timeline



Ya'akov had 12 sons who became the 12 tribes. Each had its own flag, prince and territory.



























- The tribe of *Yosef* was split into two tribes *Ephraim* and *Menashe*.

Mitzvot in Numbers

There are 613 *mitzvot* in the *Torah*. We refer to them by the *gematriah*:



248 are **Do's**(מְצְווֹת עֲשֵׂה)

which command us to do something, like keeping *Shabbat*

365 are **Don'ts** (מָצְווֹת לֹא תַעֲשֵׂה)

which command us not to do something, like not stealing

Mitzvot are of two kinds:

Between us and God בין אָדָם לְמָקוֹם

like *kashrut* and *tefillah*

Between people ין אָדָם לְחַבֵּרוֹ

like *tzedakah* and *lashon hara*



The 7 Mitzvot of Noach

The 7 *mitzvot* of *Noach* are the commandments that all human beings are expected to keep.

- 1. Don't worship idols
- 2. Don't murder
- 3. Don't steal
- 4. Don't enter a forbidden marriage
- 5. Don't curse God
- 6. Don't treat animals cruelly
- 7. Set up courts of law





The 10 Commandments

The 10 commandments were given by God to *Moshe* on Mount Sinai.

- 1. I am the Lord your God
- 2. Don't worship idols
- 3. Don't take the name of God in vain
- 4. Remember Shabbat and keep it holy
- 5. Honour your mother and father
- 6. Don't murder
- 7. Don't commit adultery
- 8. Don't steal
- 9. Don't lie
- 10. Don't be jealous


On seeing lightning
